# Guidelines for successful spelling grades in Mr. Keim's class:

## Tuesdays (or 2<sup>nd</sup> day of the week) - Sentences

*For full 12 points credit, you MUST:*

- Complete your work on time for the beginning of class.
- Write the word with syllable breaks from the dictionary (use dashes)  
ex: break-fast
- List part of speech for your spelling word (noun, verb, adjective, adverb...*don't know? Look it up!*) Failure to complete this step will result in a ZERO for the assignment.
- Give a brief definition (at least three words) based on the dictionary definition (in your own words – but enough to establish meaning) Failure to complete this step will result in a ZERO for the assignment.
- Use the spelling word in a sentence that clearly demonstrates that you understand the meaning of the word.
- Spell ALL words in your sentence correctly.
- Use correct punctuation and grammar throughout your sentence.
- Underline or **highlight** the spelling word.
- Use blue or black ink.
- These MAY be typed, be sure to use 12 point font, times New Roman or Arial Font.

### Example:

1. Territory (noun) *ter-ri-to-ry* - an area or region of knowledge, interest, or geography

Sentence: While I visited the French owned territory, I met several Frenchmen with silly hats.

**Make-up/corrections on sentences:** If your score is below 8 (out of 12), you may redo the sentences that you have missed to improve your score to an 8 (passing).

## Also Tuesdays: (or 2<sup>nd</sup> day of the week) - Tests

**Tip:** Study your spelling words with a partner.

**Make-up/corrections on tests:** If your test scores a 7 or less (out of 12) you can bring your grade up to an 8 by writing spelling corrections (writing misspelled words 10x each)

*If you are absent, you have two class days to make up any tests given. You need to stay after school!*

Bonus points

- There will be at least one bonus word or question on every spelling test, good for up to one full point on your test. There are no bonus questions on make-up tests.
